

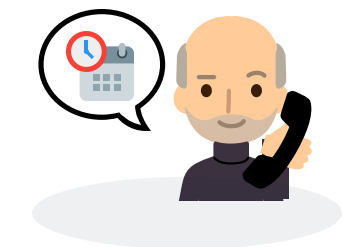
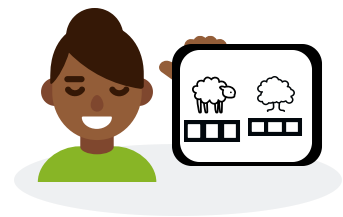
Using the NCII Lesson Plans Virtually: Tips for Supporting Parents



The NCII sample reading and math lesson plans are brief instructional routines and activities intended to provide additional practice opportunities in key reading and math skills for students receiving intensive intervention. Parents are critical partners in the delivery of virtual intensive intervention. How to Support Parents

- Select the lesson plan for the parent to deliver and communicate the student's academic goal.
- Provide lesson plan materials and adapt lessons to account for resources that cannot be acquired.
- Model the lesson plan delivery.
 - Explain lesson plan structure.
 - Model use of materials.
 - Model error correction.
 - Answer any questions.
- Develop a plan for regular check-ins with parent.
- Offer adaptations based on student needs and context.
